We need help from local people to influence the Planning Authority's vision for our village's future.

A **Neighbourhood Plan** puts in place planning policy for a neighbourhood area to guide future development. A Neighbourhood Plan is about the use and development of land and may contain a vision, aims, planning policies, proposals for improving the area.

To achieve this we need to form a Neighbourhood Forum...

A **Neighbourhood Forum** is an organisation empowered by the local planning authority to lead the neighbourhood planning process. This is a way of helping local communities to influence the planning of the area in which they live and work and can be used to develop a shared vision for your neighbourhood.

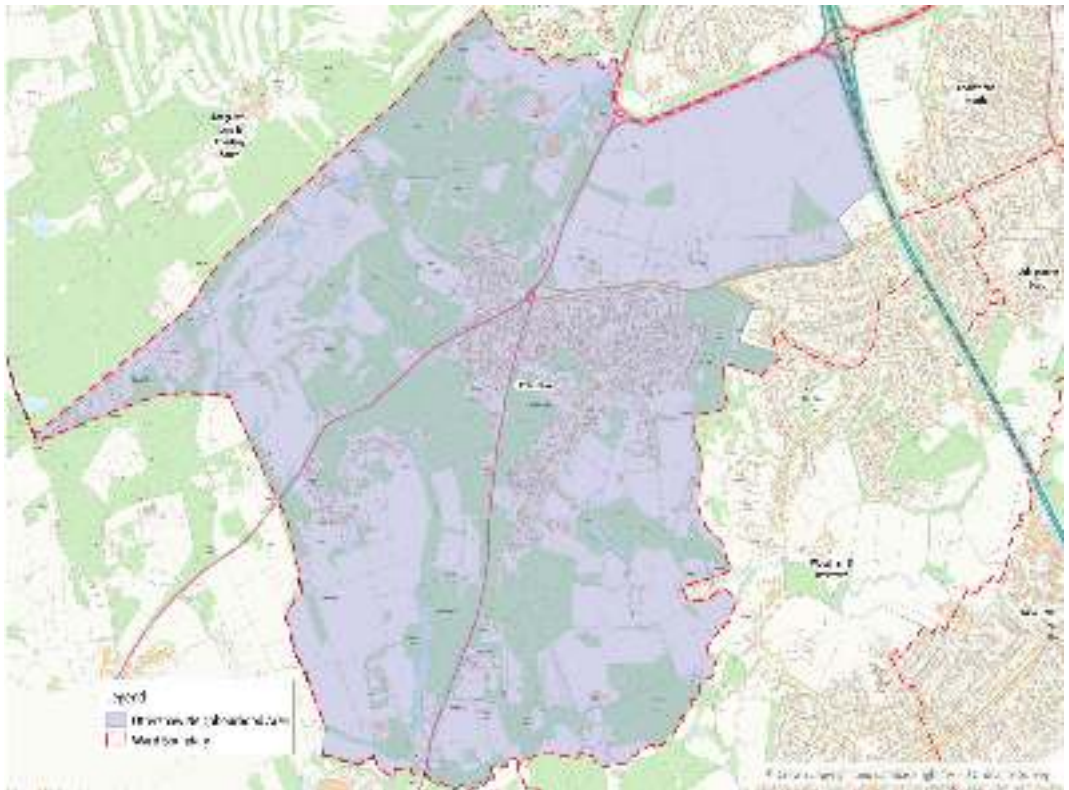




Our Proposed Neighbourhood Area...

A prerequisite to establishing a **Neighbourhood Plan** is to define what **'The Neighbourhood'** is. A working group of 19 volunteers from across the Ward, has proposed the Neighbourhood should be the whole of the Ottershaw Ward, excluding both that part East of the M25 which is considered part of the Addlestone Community, and the part of Rowtown bounded by Spinney, Ongar and Hare Hill Roads, which is considered part of the Rowtown Community. **(Please see Map below. Shaded blue area is the proposed Neighbourhood Area)**

The **Area** centres on Ottershaw village with Anningsley and Ottershaw Parks, Great Grove Farm and all the surrounding green open spaces within the Ward, forming a well-defined and clearly focused community and neighbourhood.

- Developed a proposed Constitution
- Developed a Communication Strategy and Plan

- Secured our initial Grant Funding
- Engaged with the Community
- Established a presence on the Web
